As part of the School Improvement Plan staff have undergone training in Growth Mindset with John Paul Fitzpatrick from Teachmindset.

"Growth mindset" is the name given by psychologist Carol Dweck to the idea that intelligence can develop, and that effort leads to success. We want to help to develop in our children a love of learning and the necessary resilience in life to succeed alongside the understanding that abilities can be developed through hard work and perseverance - brains and talent are just the starting point.

We will be offering a parent workshop led by some of our pupils and Mr Fitzpatrick. The tentative date is Thursday 24th May at 6.00 pm. Save the date because we would love to see you there.

#### **Pupil Profiles**

Over the past few years there have been different types of pupil profiles at LVPS. Some have been paper based others online. The Nursery (now called the Early Learning Centre) have successfully used online journals for a few years and will continue to do so.
