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## Scottish National Standardised Assessments

It will soon be time again for our Primary 7 pupils to sit the Scottish Government's standardised assessments. The assessments will be completed online in school. These assessments will be age and stage appropriate and cover aspects of reading, writing and working with numbers. This information will be used alongside information gained from other assessments and teacher's professional judgement when considering children's progress and planning and next steps in learning. It is the view of WL Council that P7 children be assessed early in the year to best support them as they prepare for transition to High School. P4s will be assessed in April and P1s possibly in May.

P7 parents will have received a photo copy of "Assessing Children's Progress: A guide for parents and carers". P1 and P4 parents and carers will get a copy in the Spring. Should you wish to have your own copy you can download it at
