That was the first time we hosted a Curriculum Café and we were delighted with the number of parents and carers who managed to attend. There were even some grandparents who made the effort to come and talked of how things have changed since they were at school. The children were excited to be able to sit down and talk about their learning. We hope that the prompts on the tables were useful and I know the feedback you gave your children was a valuable tool to help them improve going forward. We will host another Café near the next parent's consultations which will be near the end of March. I fully appreciate that not all parents can attend these events due to work commitments so you can request your child's jotters to be sent home at this time. The other challenges were Chess Circle, Cake Confusion, Calendar Conundrum and Coloured Cuboids.

P6 took part in the Edinburgh University maths week which involved using strategies and planning skills in the world of railways/routes. P2 took part in an NRICH challenge.
