Playground Update	Parent Council have previously said they are keen to get something more interesting in the playground for the children: - Priority is the pagoda - Looking at improving loose parts play e.g. tent's, pipes, crates, pegs, ropes etc the possibility of using the area at far end of playground outside P7 classroom is also being looked at, but the ground is not solid or level and is badly overhung by trees - Could PC support in fundraising for pots and plants for around the pagoda - Children to be consulted for use of pagoda e.g outdoor learning, reading corner - Storage at site of pagoda need to be improved, for resources for use in playground and pagoda Trees & Hedging: - School won trees and hedging in a competition, entered by Mrs Armstrong from ELC. There is a large number of trees (saplings) to be planted. The best time for this is November. They will be planted in the back garden and if possible in large pots in the playground to introduce some greenery - Fundraising for large pots would help the school - Any trees not used will be donated to other schools Back Garden clean up: - Volunteers are needed to help clear the back garden and woodland area just outside this area and accessed by back gate - School looking at possibility of organising a skip - Help planting containers also required - The school does not have a dedicated janitor, so any assistance with practical tasks in the garden is helpful	CS/NH
