As a staff we are aware of the effects of poverty and how it relates to the context of our school, our young people, our families and our Community.

Poverty proofing the School Day aims to support our school to identify and overcome the barriers to learning faced by children and young people from families with fewer financial resources. At the start of every school session we look at projected expense and how this will effect families. This past year has involved additional discussion/consultation with parent council, pupils around costs and plans take the following into account:

- Excursions and events are planned in advance to ensure parents/carers are notified in a timely manner.
- Class trips are limited in number to help reduce the cost.
- This year again it was agreed the school funds would significantly reduce any trip costs.
- We make best use of our local community and visitors to enhance learning experiences where possible.
- All free trips and experiences are applied for
- All pupils can attend residential experiences in P6 and P7 with the cluster for a short camp and a payment plan is always agreed in advance.
- Dress down days are limited to monthly these have been reduced again this year to incorporated other key events to avoid parents being asked to pay too much.

Targeted Support

- Consideration is given to transport costs for all trips where walking is not an option.
- Support is available to families for financial assistance if and when required.
- Bursaries are applied for with families.
- PEF money supports some of the camp costs for pupils with FME
- PEF Universal support allows us to offer a significantly reduced cost for our annual trip to the theatre at Christmas.
- Parent Council Run events have been costed the same for past three years
- P7 parents will give consideration to financial difficulties when planning leavers events so no child will be left out
